Students

At Risk Students

The board is committed to provide a successful educational experience for students. To this end the board shall strive to remove any barriers that inhibit the accomplishment of this goal by:

- A. identifying students who exhibit one or more characteristics that are associated with school failure:
 1. poor, irregular and/or deteriorating attendance patterns;
 2. poor, irregular and/or deteriorating work habits and achievement as indicated on periodic reports to parents;
 3. frequent, regular, or increasing conflict with peers, teachers, or other school authorities;
 4. other behavior or indicators apparent in an elementary school child who is not succeeding in school, (e.g., withdrawal from normal, daily academic and social activities; apathy toward the school environment).
- B. collecting and reviewing data that are associated with the failure syndrome;
- C. prescribing and delivering educational services based upon the diagnosed needs and related objectives for each individual student in conjunction with his/her parent(s)
- D. monitoring and enforcing the provisions of the services;
- E. seeking and directing additional resources toward the needs of the identified students;
- F. monitoring the progress of individual students as each moves toward the district's desired student outcomes; and
- G. recognizing the achievements of individual students.

Parents of students receiving specialized services in the student retention and retrieval program shall be advised of progress on a regular basis.

The superintendent is directed to incorporate the philosophy and the processes of this policy into the school setting. Progress will be reviewed by the board at least once each year.
